State Revolving Fund (“SRF”) Staff consistently reviews program demand, future projects and their estimated costs (“project pipeline”), and current, available levels of loan and PF funding. Staff has agreed to make PF limit recommendations at the June and December Board meetings, and more often, as needed.

As a result of the receipt of the 2025 DWRF and WPCRF Base capitalization grants, required PF, in addition to growing unallocated DWRF and WPCRF PF balances, and growing DWRF demand and project pipeline, staff has reviewed the current policies and limits and is recommending the following changes highlighted below:

Background/ Reason and Need

To provide consistent messaging and be responsive to demand, SRF staff review and make recommendations regarding principal forgiveness (PF) caps and maxes at the June and December CWRPDA board meetings.

Recommendation: After reviewing the current PF limits and projects in the SRF pipeline and considering the imminent implementation of the new project prioritization process, the DAC subcommittee recommends the following changes to the existing limits.

WPCRF IIJA supplemental:

- **Current limit:**
 - DAC: \$1.5 million PF limit
 - IIJA-eligible non-DAC: \$0 PF limit
- **Recommendation:**
 - DAC: no change, \$1.5 million PF limit
 - IIJA-eligible non-DAC: \$500,000 PF limit
- **Rationale:**
 - Estimated available PF until next cap grant: \$15,261,320
 - Estimated project pipeline: \$44,188,436 (anticipated WPCRF DAC projects through June 2026). Note: this may be an underestimate due to WPCRF entities not being screened for IIJA eligibility, prior to the 2026 IUP update.
 - Demand on this side of the program has declined over the past year, resulting in a growing PF balance. A \$1.5 million PF limit for DACs allows us to spread funding across more projects as quickly as possible to meet spenddown requirements while still providing substantial PF. The recommendation to increase the limit for IIJA-eligible non-DACs to \$500,000 is also due to the growing, accumulating PF balance. This will help us get money out to IIJA-eligible borrowers in a more timely fashion, and DACs remain the top priority.
 - Note: A 2026 IUP change makes non-DAC borrowers eligible for IIJA funds if they meet the IIJA-eligibility criteria outlined in the IUP.

WPCRF Base

- **Current limit:** \$500,000 (DACs only)
- **Recommendation:** no change

- **Rationale:**
 - Estimated available PF until the next cap grant: \$4,235,322
 - Estimated project pipeline: \$137,213,279 (all anticipated WPCRF projects through June 2026)
 - Historically, the program has not offered PF for WPCRF Base projects. As of June 6, 2025, due to the increased availability of funds in the cap grant and growing accumulation of unallocated PF funds, the Authority Board approved a \$500,000 PF limit for eligible projects (DACs only).

DWRF IIJA supplemental

- **Current limit:**
 - DAC: \$2 million PF limit
 - IIJA-eligible non-DAC: \$1 million PF limit
- **Recommendation:**
 - DAC: \$2.5 million PF limit
 - IIJA-eligible non-DAC: \$1.5 million PF limit
- **Rationale:**
 - Estimated available PF until the next cap grant: \$21,725,086
 - Estimated project pipeline: \$130,644,515 (anticipated DWRF DAC projects through June 2026)
 - Demand on the DWRF IIJA Supplemental has been high, but so have the received grant amounts. This balance has increased slightly over the past year, and staff wanted the flexibility to be able to distribute PF to eligible projects at a quicker pace. There are 10 DACs, 4 Preliminary DACs, 12 non-DACs, and 6 projects without an eligibility determination in the pipeline through June 2026. While there may not be enough available PF for all of the eligible projects in the pipeline, especially after accounting for the AVC projects, the recommended caps will help to spread the funds more widely and continue to fund projects out of the IIJA pot when the base program PF funds are minimal.

DWRF Base

- **Current limit:** \$1 million PF limit (DACs only)
- **Recommendation:** no change
- **Rationale:**
 - Estimated available PF until next cap grant: \$4,306,583
 - Estimated project pipeline: \$242,118,518 (all anticipated DWRF projects through June 2026)
 - After accounting for D&E PF allocations, there is not likely to be much PF available in this pot. However, leaving the cap at \$1 million allows for more consistent and less confusing messaging and allows for the possibility of multiple projects to receive some amount of base PF.

DWRF Lead Service Lines

- **Current limit:** \$10 million PF limit
- **Recommendation:** no change
- **Rationale:**
 - Estimated available PF until next cap grant: \$3,096,810

- Estimated project pipeline: \$52,500,000 (all anticipated LCR projects through June 2026)
- The 2024 LSL Capitalization Grant was \$32,800,000. The 2025 LSL Capitalization Grant allotment has not been announced nor allocated yet, but it is estimated to be for a similar amount. We have applied for and received two separate lead reallocations as well. The above remaining PF number does not include the 2025 estimated grant. Two projects (Aurora and La Junta) are in the current pipeline, and Aurora has been patiently waiting for additional LSL money to become available before they apply to the SRF. Setting a limit too low that prevents spend-down should not be a concern as demand is high in this program. As with the DWRF base program recommendation, leaving the cap at \$10 million allows for more consistent and less confusing messaging than changing the limit at this time when not many funds are available.

DWRF Emerging Contaminants

- **Current limit:** \$30 million PF limit
- **Recommendation:** no change
- **Rationale:**
 - Estimated available PF until next cap grant: \$16,779,000
 - Estimated project pipeline: \$10,000,000 (all anticipated EC projects through June 2026)
 - We recommend retaining this limit because there are still not many emerging contaminants applications expected in the last half of 2025 and into early 2026. Also, WQCD received additional grant funding for PFAS projects. Snake River Water District, Thornton, Silverthorne, and a few other entities have upcoming EC projects that might apply in 2026.

WPCRF Emerging Contaminants

- **Current limit:** No limit currently
- **Recommendation:** no change/no limit
- **Rationale:**
 - Estimated available funds until next cap grant: \$3,402,000
 - Estimated project pipeline: \$0
 - No new limit is recommended because there are still no emerging contaminants applications expected in 2025 or 2026 and because WQCD received additional grant funding for PFAS projects. Additionally, the program has transferred any available funds to the DWRF EC pot and will continue to do so going forward, unless a WPCRF EC project enters the pipeline. The 2024 transfer is waiting on EPA approval.

Other Current Limits:

- **Per pot limit:**
 - IIJA-eligible communities that do not also meet the base program Disadvantaged communities criteria are limited to receiving IIJA funding once from each of the following:
 - DWRF IIJA Supplemental
 - DWRF Lead Service Line
 - DWRF Emerging Contaminants
 - WPCRF Emerging Contaminants
 - Disadvantaged Communities may fund projects multiple times using IIJA funding
- **Recommendation:** no change

In addition, the Authority Board adopts the Interim and SHLP loan rates each year. The Interim and SHLP loan programs are Authority programs and not governed by the IUPs.

RE: State Revolving Fund (SRF) Prioritization Model - Open Loan Application Cycles

In June 2024, the Board approved the new SRF Prioritization Model and incorporated it into the 2025 IUP, which was implemented on January 1, 2025. Overall, the Prioritization Model has functioned as staff anticipated; however, there is one adjustment related to the OPEN and LIMITED loan cycles that staff is recommending. With the revised model now in place, staff has observed a notable decrease in SRF application activity during the second half of the year. The structure of seven loan cycles, including two OPEN cycles for all projects and five LIMITED cycles for priority projects, has provided reliable funding for those projects with the greatest need. However, the lower-than-expected utilization during the later cycles has resulted in uneven workload throughout the year.

Staff recommends the Board authorize two additional OPEN cycles on April 5 and June 5. Adding these cycles will help balance application volume across the year, provide communities with additional opportunities to seek financing during a period of reduced demand, and support more consistent staff workflow. These additional cycles do not modify the prioritization structure previously approved by the Board but instead provide operational flexibility to align with program usage and better meet borrowers' construction schedules.

RE: State Revolving Fund (SRF) Prioritization Model

The current first-come, first-served SRF prioritization model has been in place since the inception of the SRF programs. However, it has seldom been used because demand for the SRF program has rarely exceeded the amount of SRF funds. With the implementation of the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) in 2022, the demand for SRF dollars has increased sharply, causing the SRF program to prioritize more regularly. SRF staff, due to the necessitated increased use of the prioritization model, created a sub-committee to improve the current prioritization model to meet the SRF's and the Board's funding goals. The sub-committee, with prior Board input, is recommending adjusting the prioritization model as outlined in the table below to focus SRF funding on priority projects while meeting EPA spend down requirements.

Recommendation: Staff recommends the Board approve the above changes to the SRF Prioritization Model and incorporate these changes into the 2025 IUP.
